



## Analytic Evaluation of the May 18 March in New-York

The degree of success of this experiment was very much the subject of speculation of many interested on this unique march since it took place in New-York City on Haiti's Flag Day. Those motivated by the essence of this effort are rejoicing of their accomplishment. This coalition of professional associations including particularly the AMHE (Haitian Medical Association abroad ) and Hana ( Haitian American Nurses Association ) have delivered their contribution for the resolution of the quagmire, that reigns in Haiti. And that by itself deserves a high qualifying mark. The reservations expressed around the March are exclusively based on the number of participants estimated at about 3 to 400, which is indeed not flattering when our reference point is still the march run in 1980 by the Haitians fighting against their classification as factor for the development of HIV/AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome). The group this time was not as significant in number, but it was exuberant but well disciplined. It was as determined as before, and confident that their cause was right and worthy.

This march was only the beginning of a campaign already supported by the members of the AMHE (Haitian Medical Association abroad ), as demonstrated by their large participation, including our elder: Dr. Wesner Fleurant and our leadership represented by Roosevelt Clerisme and Dr. Eric Jerome. The public was missing because some more work and ingenuity are required to share these ideas and concepts for their endorsement.

The work of aligning any interested citizen behind these goals is still to be done.

Our constituency for the most part has already objected to the initial proposition of having boots on the grounds, to save Haiti. In case the international community is still willing to help, there can be a lot of good achieved in controlling the illegal trafficking of arms in Haiti and in forcefully pursuing those involved in money laundering for the benefit of the bandits who are terrorizing the entire country. The police force in Haiti can use some well-directed support and guidance These requests are now addressed to the Core Group and to any other interested party for appropriate consideration in their deliberation.

This message is now delivered and reinforced by the words delivered in front of the United Nations Building by the organizers of this March and particularly Dr Louis Auguste and Dr Karl Latortue President of the AMHE, who were followed by the leaders of a few committed associations.

I invite everybody to rally to that cause for being the most reasonable one and to give Haiti a chance to survive.
